# Matthew 27:57-66

The doctrine of the resurrection is the foundation doctrine of the New Testament. The resurrection is mentioned 104 times in the New Testament. Christianity is the only religion with the living originator. Buddha is dead, Brahma (Hinduism) is dead, Mohammed is dead, Karl Marx is dead. The boast and glory of Christianity is the empty tomb. Jesus is risen.

If Jesus did not rise from the grave, we are all men most miserable. The reason being is because we would still be in our sin, lost, eternally lost, 1 Corinthians 15:12-19. Jesus said that he would die and rise again from the dead the third day, Matthew 16:21. If this, the greatest of miracles is true, then it is easy to believe all the rest.

  - 8. By the testimony of millions who have proved Him to be a living Savior.
  - 9. By many infallible proofs, Acts 1:3.

    - a. A hoax
    - b. The body of Jesus was stolen away.
  - 2. The swoon theory.
    - a. Jesus only fainted.
    - b. He did not die
    - c. The cool tomb revived him.

  - a. A projected wish.
  - b. The disciples were incredulously unbelieving for which Jesus rebuked them.

- 4. The ghost theory.
  - a. A ghost does not have flesh and bones or eat and drink.

  - a. Wild story passed down.

  - a. Jesus Christ rose bodily from the grave as He said that He would.

  - a. I will come again

- 6. The power of His resurrection is an experience that we may enjoy now.
